

CLINTON COUNTY NEWSPAPERS

From 1838 to the Present

The Eagle (weekly) – August 1838

The Clintonian (weekly) – Same paper as The Eagle. Name was changed to conform with the name of the new county – 1840

The Clinton County Whig (weekly) – the Clintonian was revived after a brief suspension and continued until 1847

The Clinton Tribune (weekly) – 1849

The American Watchman (weekly) – the Tribune under a new name 1854-1861

Clinton County Democrat (weekly) - 1840 – suspended, then revived in 1843

The Clinton Democrat (weekly) – 1844 – merged with Clinton County Democrat – 1845

The Clinton Democrat (weekly) – 1845-1921 – merger of the two papers directly above.

The Logansville Democrat (weekly) – German language, published in Logansville (now Loganton) – 1853

The Lock Haven News (weekly) – 1861

The Lock Haven Press (weekly) – 1861 – the same paper as The Lock Haven News

The Clinton Republican (weekly) – 1863-1921

The Enterprise (weekly) – 1873

The Independent (daily) – 1869

Quid Nunc (daily) – the same paper as The Independent – 1869

The Daily Journal (daily) – published from The Enterprise office – 1877-1883

The Renovo Record (weekly – later daily) – 1871

The Weekly Journal – 1879

The Evening Express (daily) – 1882

The County Journal (weekly) – established in Loganton – 1886

The Sugar Valley Journal (weekly) – continuation of The County Journal – published until the First World War – 1884 - 1917

The Valley Chief – a continuation of The Sugar Valley Journal

The Mill Hall Times – 1897

The Clinton Dispatch (daily) – published from Democrat office – 1914-1917

The Lock Haven Express (daily) 1917 – merger of The Clinton Dispatch and The Evening Express, with The Weekly Express, merger of Clinton Democrat and Clinton Republican

NOTE: Claims to have been established March 1, 1882.
